Dear Chairman Brady,

The American Society for Gastrointestinal Endoscopy (ASGE) offers its strong support of and encourages Committee approval of the "Ambulatory Surgical Center Payment Transparency Act of 2018" (H.R. 6138). ASCs are important to the practice of gastroenterology, providing a safe, convenient and cost-effective health care site of service.

The legislation does two important things to ensure that the value of ambulatory surgery centers (ASC) to patients and the health care system is recognized by Medicare. First, the legislation adds an ASC representative to the Advisory Panel on Hospital Outpatient Payment. Second, it requires the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services to disclose which criteria have triggered an exclusion of procedures from the ASC procedure list.

We remind the Committee, however, that the gap continues to widen between Medicare payments for services provided in the Hospital Outpatient Department and in the ASC. Legislating that ASC payments should be updated annually using the hospital market basket index would help to stem the widening gap between HOPD and ASC payments and improve ASC payment predictability. In fact, pursuit of getting procedures and services approved for payment in the ASC setting is sometimes met with reimbursement so inadequate that there is no incentive for physicians to provide the service in the ASC setting. This does not improve patient access.

ASGE applauds your commitment to advance H.R. 6138 and looks forward to continuing to work with you to ensure payment adequacy for services provided in the ASC.
